Online Reporting System, “COPLOGIC” Debuts

The New Bern Police Department is proud to announce a new online police reporting option for the public. This web based reporting system will allow the public to file the following incident types over the internet at their convenience:

- Damage to a Motor Vehicle (Does not include damage associated with an accident)
- Damage to Property
- Lost / Missing Property
- Harassing Phone Calls
- Theft (Value must be under \$1000.00 and no theft of medication can be reported online)

“I expect this internet based reporting service to be very popular among citizens who have come to expect police services to be provided immediately and conveniently online”, said Chief Toussaint E. Summers Jr.

The service allows the public to file a report at a time that is best for them without having to wait for an officer to respond or call them back. The public will be able to print a temporary copy of the report upon submitting the report. The report is reviewed by police personnel and once approved, the filing person will receive an email with a copy of the report attached without cost. The report will transfer into the New Bern Police Departments records management system and receive the same investigative and statistical analysis as if the report had been filed by a police officer.
